s celebrity playgrounds go, Marbella is one of the most glamorous getaways. Jordan and the entire The Only Way Is Essex (TOWIE) gang have donned their barely-there bikinis and high heels to party there recently.

And so my friends were "well jel" (really jealous) that Jet2holidays flew me off on a press trip to see what all the fuss is about – following a "no carbs before Marbs diet", naturally.

Marbella means "beautiful sea" and that is exactly what you see along its golden coastline.

To rub shoulders with the jet set. however, it's safe to say that my journalist's wage does not stretch to even one bottle of Dom Perignon.

But even if you're more Primark than Prada, you can still have a touch of the high-life without the sky-high price tag.

One night we visited Puerto Banus, six kilometers southwest of Marbella, the epicentre of glitz and glamour.

With its marina full of luxury yachts, fancy restaurants and designer shops, it is a favourite of A-listers and mere mortals alike (for the latter, thankfully there's bar touts offering free drinks).

We stayed at the four-star Hotel Iberostar Marbella Coral Beach, which far exceeded my expectations of a budget airline package holiday.

It's set on the exclusive Golden Mile area, where you will find the most elite nightclubs, restaurants and lavish properties. (Nearby is the late King Fahd of Saudi Arabia's Mar Mar palace, a gleaming replica of the United States White House.) This elegant, newlyrenovated hotel has a Jacuzzi and sauna and spacious, contemporary, all-white guest rooms with marble floors.

Its peaceful setting is ideal for couples and families and its proximity to the

beach (a stone's throw away), Puerto Banus (one kilometre) and downtown Marbella (four kilometres) is a bonus. Guests can even help themselves to fizz at breakfast, "totally reem" as TOWIE's Joey Essex would say (it means good).

However, while Marbella was as bling as I imagined it, I discovered there is so much more to the city than designer shops, chic bars and celebrated golf

Our delightful tour guide Trinidad Blanco showed us around the charming



Old Town, a hidden gem of a place contained inside the ninth century Alcazaba week-long street party with plenty of wall, popularly known as The Castle.

A delicate scent of orange blossom permeates the warren of narrow white-washed streets, where you'll find old churches, squares and authentic tapas bars

the Avenue del Mar, notable for its extensive collections of Dali sculptures.

We stayed during the annual fair in

Marbella called La Feria de San Barnabé, a flamenco and fino (sherry).

We also visited Malaga city, where there's so much to do and a visit to Picasso's birth house and museum is a must. A venture up to the Parador de Malaga Gibralfaro is worthwhile for its unparalleled views of the city (though the sight of the bull ring I A short stroll away towards the seafront is found rather nauseating).

> If you like wine and tapas, go to Bodega El Pimpi, a Spanish wine bar famous in the area, displaying wine barrels signed by

celebrities including Antonio Banderas (who originates from the city).

We also took a trip to the nearby town of Fuengirola to the zoo, which is small vet designed to allow its residents space in realistic natural habitats while enabling visitors to get right up close – even to razor-sharp-toothed crocodiles.

A visit to Mijas, a delightful, typically Andalusian white-washed village, was also worthwhile for its amazing views of the surrounding mountains

The Wine Museum there offers wine tastings and the chance to learn about the town's small but growing wine industry.

We spent one night at the Hotel Meliá Costa del Sol in Torremolinos, a resort dominated by many high-rise buildings, which is just outside Malaga and popular with British tourists.

A 15-minute walk along the seafront from our hotel took us to Puerto Marina in Benalmadena, one of the largest marinas in Andalusia (with space for 1,000 yachts).

We went on a boat trip when I decided there is nothing better than lying back in the sun, with a beer in hand, watching wild

We returned here at night to experience and the marina (light up beautifully at

the buzzing nightlife along the esplanade dark). I possible had too much fun at Boal's Icebar (wearing a huge furry coat and flipflops in -11 degrees C) and went on yet another boat trip (who can say no to a free bar on the 35-minute trip). Indeed with tapas, paella and sangria aplenty, there were far too many carbs in Marbs. What would the TOWIE girls say?
