## ORCHIDS

Skincare infused with orchid extract has become a real 'thing' in the beauty industry, and for a very good reason: the wee, kick-ass blossom is packed with antioxidants and has that live-forever longevity that translates into less wrinkles, more firmness for ageing skin. Clarins' Blue Orchid Face Treatment Oil is legendary for delivering a luscious, healthy dose of softening and hydrating, via plant pigments called anthocyanins — also present in blueberries— known for their anti-inflammatory properties. Guerlain has also staked its claim on the new 'It' flower, trotting the globe to discover rare species to add to its Geneva-based Orchid Library. Their inimitable Orchidée Impériale Eye and Lip Cream draws on the wrinkle-busting powers of *Dendrobium chrysotoxum*, or gold orchid, grown in the company's Tianzi Exploratory Nature Reserve on the mainland.

## SAXIFRAGE

While some brands are deep-sea diving in search of the next big ingredient, others are heading to the hills, specifically The Dom mountains in Switzerland. A team led by Dr Daniel Stangl, an active mountaineer and La Prairie's director of innovation, recently discovered two unrivalled plants—*saxifraga oppositifolia* and *soldanella alpina*—thriving in the ice and snow. The team combined them with extracts of snow algae (another plant that flourishes in high-altitude, extreme conditions) to develop the hydrating and resilience-boosting complex at the heart of the new Cellular Swiss Ice Crystal Cream and Dry Oil. "To be able to capture the youth-protecting properties and adaptive nature of the three survivalist plants and combine those with revolutionary technologies of modern skincare is exceptional," says Stangl.



## CACTUS OIL

While everyone's been oohing and aahing over Argan oil, which has become the most covetable, sought-after skin oil over the past few years, cactus oil is the new craze set to topple Argan off it's lofty high horse. ## GRAPES

While not entirely new to the skincare world, grape extract is having a major moment with numerous brands getting on the bandwagon. Leading the pack is French vineyard-grown brand Caudalie, with grape vines thriving throughout their family estate in Chateau Smith Haut Lafitte. "The vine is an incredible treasure of benefits and riches. In my vineyard, we say then when a vine cries, the faces of women illuminate," says co-founder Mathilde Thomas. Grapes are rich with polyphenols, the most powerful anti-oxidant on the planet, viniferine from grapevine sap that beats dark spots and infuses radiance, and grape-seed oil that is highly concentrated in Omega 6.
