The best technology training in the industry

Training for our members is provided at the Riverside/San Bernardino Electrical Training Center – the *only* facility of its kind in the Inland Empire. Established in 1971 to provide comprehensive training for union electricians, the Electrical Training Center expanded nearly a decade ago to include training for certified low-voltage systems professionals.

The state-approved curriculum offered at this facility is researched and regularly updated by a national apprenticeship foundation, so it covers all the latest electrical technologies, systems and methodologies. The curriculum is also vendor-independent, which is vastly different from the training available to those who are not members of the Electrical Business Alliance.

Most non-members rely on short vendor seminars for industry-related education, but our apprentices work with a wide array of electrical technologies for three to five years before graduating to journeyman status. And advanced courses for journeymen are developed before widespread adoption of new technologies, so our members are always ahead of the curve.
