



16.57 Square Miles


Population Density: 6,066.9 / sq mi





Public Facilities & Infrastructure


- Project to bring more streets and sidewalks into ADA compliance




Purpose:

- Prevent bias
- Adjust for the difference in the three formats of the survey (paper copy, survey monkey, sticker board)
- Make the numbers work for a game similar to "Family Feud" (100 people surveyed)
- Scientific? NO! Meant to infuse the conversation about community needs for individuals and families of low to moderate income in Quincy
- Ask Questions: What surprises you about the data? Why do you think respondents answered the way they did? What should that mean for us as decision makers for funding, collaborations, partnerships?
