- Worked with the National Security Council, Treasury, and USAID on development policy, including establishment of the Millennium Challenge Corporation and setting U.S. G8 proposals.
- Served several terms as Chairman of the OECD's Executive Committee.
- Served as **Interim Undersecretary of State** and Foreign Affairs Sous-Sherpa for the G8 process in 2005.
- Longest serving EB Assistant Secretary: worked for three Secretaries of State.
