

The most recent

@sandiegounified
reported 982 students
to police during the
2017-18 school year.

That's by far **the most** of all school districts in San Diego County.



With rates higher than the national average, the district disproportionately reported Black children and students with disabilities.



The district's Black students were reported to police at rates 34% higher than their white counterparts.



Children with disabilities made up over 30% of @sandiegounified's referrals but account for only 14% of the district's student



population.

Alba Community Day School

has the highest referral rate in the county.

Some Alba kids are there because they're transitioning out of the juvenile court system.

Its rate is more than
60 times
the national average.

It's reported nine of its 33 students to police.

More than 10% of the kids who @sandiegounified reported to police were elementary school students.
