6:52 pm	Carolyn MacKenzie	<p>Thank you, Sean!</p> <p>MODC has a simple goal – to create a more inclusive, accessible society for Canadians living with disabilities, including the more than 400,000 stroke survivors here in Canada.</p> <p>As many of us know from first or second-hand experience, stroke affects everyone differently. It can impact mobility, cognition, speech, emotions – any or all of these may be affected either temporarily or permanently. Stroke survivors and their caregivers have to navigate a new normal that can be challenging and overwhelming, and once they leave the hospital, they don't know where to turn.</p> <p>That's why March of Dimes Canada created After Stroke.</p> <p>After Stroke is a new model of care that supports stroke survivors, care-givers, and health care professionals on the journey from hospital back to home, and from the home back into the community. It includes a wide variety of programs and services that address the potential physical, communicative, cognitive, and emotional effects of a stroke, and encourages stroke survivors to embrace their new normal.</p> <p>March of Dimes Canada's work also includes supporting innovative research that has the potential to change lives through the annual Jonas Salk Award.</p> <p>Since 1994, March of Dimes Canada has presented this award to a Canadian scientist whose work contributes to the alleviation, elimination, or prevention of a disabling condition. The Award includes \$10,000 and acknowledges Dr. Salk's</p>
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		<p>legacy as a humanitarian as well as a scientist. The recipient is chosen by a scientific advisory committee, and I'm very pleased to now introduce the Chair of the Jonas Salk Awards Committee, and long-standing March of Dimes Canada board member, to present the 2017 Jonas Salk Award.</p> <p>Dr. Luis Barreto is President of Dr. Luis Barreto + Associates, a consultancy firm specializing in vaccine development, science policy, and global health. He is a member of key Canadian and international expert panels and advisory boards including the Council of Canadian Academies, McMaster, Maastricht, and Manipal Universities.</p> <p>Dr. Barreto became a March of Dimes Canada supporter when he was Vice President of Immunization and Science Policy at Sanofi Pasteur Ltd, and initiated their support for this award. For the last several years, he has been a member of the board of March of Dimes Canada as well as the Chair of the Salk Awards Committee. 6:57 pm	Dr. Luis Barreto	<p>Thank you, Carolyn.</p> <p>Each year, March of Dimes Canada presents the Jonas Salk Award to a Canadian scientist, physician, or researcher who has made a new and outstanding contribution in science or medicine to prevent, alleviate, or eliminate a physical disability. Worth \$10,000, the award honours people who are making a difference in the lives of Canadians living with disabilities.</p>

		<p>This year's Jonas Salk Award recipient is Dr. Denis Richard. Dr. Richard has been conducting research on the complex etiology of obesity for more than 30 years. Dr. Richard's research is extensive, including examining cellular mechanisms in the body that influence food intake and energy expenditure which in turn influence obesity, but also translational; his research has influenced best practices for obesity treatment in humans.</p> <p>Dr. Richard is a prolific, high-quality researcher (over 300 peer-reviewed articles, and his papers cited nearly 16,000 times) with international recognition, a director of two outstanding Canadian research centres, as well as a full time professor at the Faculty of Medicine at Université Laval. He has mentored many university students, and is a member of several professional organizations.</p> <p>Dr. Richard has demonstrated throughout his illustrious career his leadership, innovative thinking, and support for community outreach. He has consistently pushed the boundaries of high quality obesity research, supported student trainees to reach their goals, advocated for health research and education in Québec, and as Director, elevated the Quebec Heart and Lung Institute Research Center to great heights, now recognized as one of the top 20 research centers in the world. Dr. Richard is relentless and passionate in his work, which has immense impact and potential to affect the lives of those living with disabilities, and countless other Canadian lives. (Michael, you can add a personal note if you like)</p> <p>CBS journalist and popular television news personality, Mark McEwen served for many years in a variety of high profile positions, including anchoring "CBS This Morning" and as entertainment reporter for "The Early Show." He was also a correspondent on the CBS News show, "48 Hours."</p> <p>He's interviewed prominent newsmakers like Bill Clinton, Steven Spielberg, Sidney Poitier, and Muhammad Ali, and covered everything from the Oscars and the Grammy Awards to three Winter Olympics. He even ran with the Olympic torch in Nagano.</p> <p>In 2005, Mark suffered a stroke.
