Patient centered care is the heart and soul of what we do. Memorial Health System's Therapy Services team is able to treat our patients with individualized plans. We pride ourselves on our clinical skills and our ability to treat every patient with any diagnosis. We work with our referring physicians to follow their protocols while also possessing advanced critical thinking skills to develop an individual, custom treatment plan that our physicians trust and value. Our patient treatments consist of a one to one patient to therapist ratio for a 45 minute to one hour session each.

## ■ OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY (OT)

Occupational therapists are highly-educated, board certified health care professionals who help patients participate in the daily activities they want and need to be able to do.

Our occupational therapists will perform a personalized evaluation to identify improvement opportunities that are specific to each patient's needs and will result in optimizing functional independence. Our team also works with patients to improve visual deficits, household and money management skills, self-care, community re-entry including return to leisure activities and oncology survivorship programs. They combine their own talents with our certified driver's rehabilitation instructor to perform driving evaluations and behind-the-wheel training.

## ■ PHYSICAL THERAPY (PT)

Physical therapists are highly-educated, licensed health care professionals who help patients reduce pain and improve mobility. They will help patients no matter how old or new the injury and will teach them how to overcome or best manage their condition as well as reduce further risk of reinjury. Our physical therapists will evaluate a patient's current condition in a one on one treatment session that will produce a plan of care specific to the patient's needs and focus on their goals for pain reduction, improved mobility and function with an overarching goal of improving overall health and wellness. Our therapists also work to help patients with urinary incontinence, vestibular therapy (dizziness), sports related injuries, dry-needling, IASTM (instrument-assisted soft tissue mobilization), concussion rehabilitation, as well as industrial services for return to work and pre-work screenings.

## ■ SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST (SLP)

Our speech language pathologists are highly educated, board certified clinicians who help patients with speech and language disorders including stuttering, voice resonance, receptive and expressive language and social communication. Our pathologists also help patients with swallowing disorders to improve their ability to safely eat, as well as patients with cognitive impairments who wish to improve attention, memory, planning, problem solving and thought organization. They also provide rehabilitation for diagnoses such as Parkinson's Disease including LSVT® LOUD services. We also offer VitalStim®, oncology survivorship programs and help with skills needed to return to school or work following concussions and brain injuries.
